PROCLAMATION

**OFFICE OF THE MAYOR
CITY OF FARMINGTON, MISSOURI**

125th Anniversary of St. Joseph Parish

WHEREAS, the canonical establishment of St. Joseph as a Roman Catholic parish of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis was on July 27, 1890; and,

WHEREAS, previous to this establishment of the recognition of a canonical parish, the first Mass celebrated in Farmington was in the home of Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Lang at 223 E. Columbia Street in 1862; and,

WHEREAS, it was not until 1869 that the first church for the mission parish, a frame structure, was built under the direction of Father Daley, pastor of the church at French Village. The frame church cost \$600 and seated 80 people; and,

WHEREAS, the site on which the current church was built was a gift of Mr. & Mrs. John F. Bush. Mr. Bush was a Missouri State Senator elected in 1862; and,

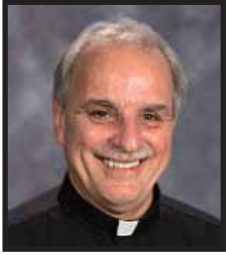
WHEREAS, the present church was built on the site of the first church. Archbishop Glennon, Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis, dedicated the church on October 13, 1912; and,

WHEREAS, the parish of Saint Joseph has been served by 26 pastors since July 1890 and 20 associate pastors since 1940; and,

WHEREAS, the present pastor, Very Reverend Rickey J. Valleroy V.F., the current Dean of Ste. Genevieve Deanery, came to pastor the flock of Saint Joseph's in August 2005. The parish family currently consists of 630 families (about 1,900 people) and under his pastoral leadership continues to grow.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Farmington, I, Stuart "Mit" Landrum, do hereby deem it an honor and pleasure to extend this Certificate of Recognition to St. Joseph Parish Catholic Church on the occasion of its 125th anniversary.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I do hereby set my hand, and cause the Corporate Seal of the City to be affixed this 27th day of June 2015.

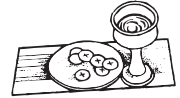

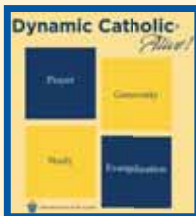

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's scripture readings. They all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are "[h]ard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a "thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that "He was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6). We, too, sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Radiating Strength

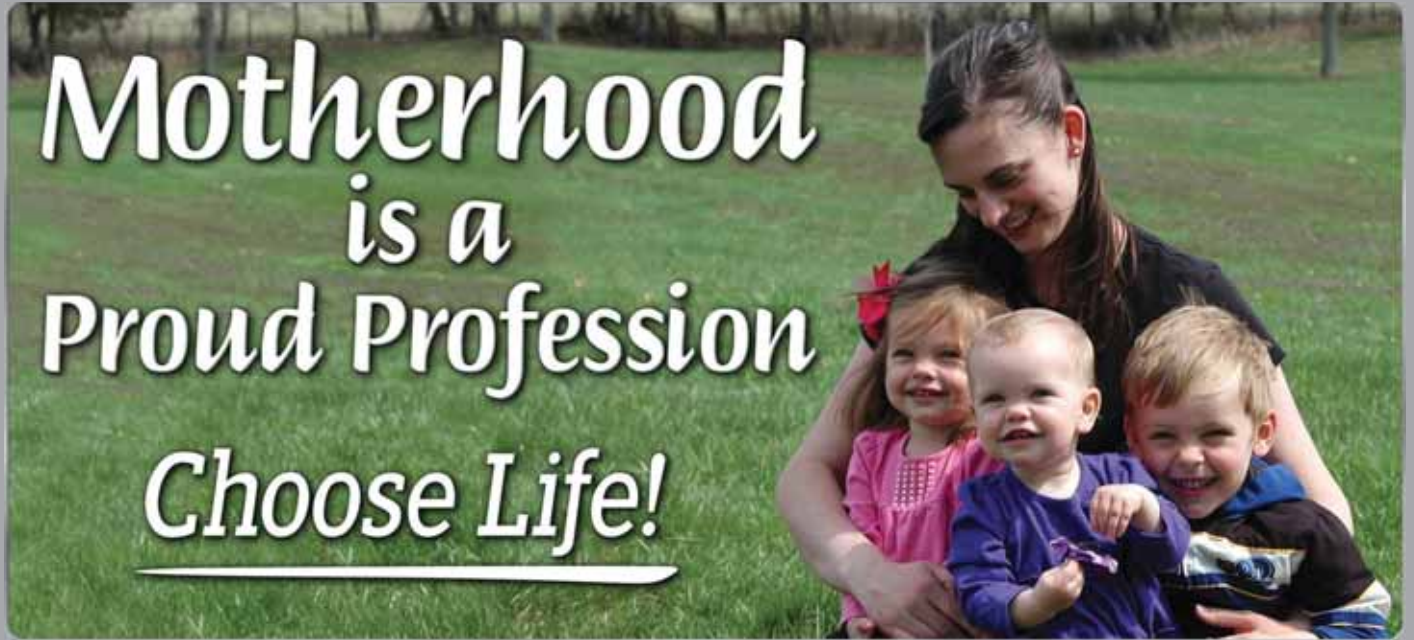
When my youngest sister, Joanne, who had suffered for many years with multiple sclerosis, lay dying in her hospital bed, we members of her family gathered around her for her final days. We watched as any remaining strength left in her fragile body was slowly released. Joanne, like Saint Paul, had been given a "thorn in the flesh," a thorn that gradually robbed her of the ability to walk, sing, speak, and care for her young son. Yet each time I visited her over the final years of her life, I detected an inner strength that amazed me. Like Saint Paul, in her physical weakness she was still strong. And that strength radiated from her, even in her dying days, giving all of us the fortitude to grow even stronger as a loving family.



Strength From The Love Of God

Society tries to dictate what strength is. Strength is being "number one." Strength is making the most money, having the most powerful position in a company, being the quarterback, and climbing the social ladder. Today we hear scripture stories of three people who exhibited a different kind of strength. Ezekiel, Paul, and the Lord Jesus were not people who found strength in the material things of life. And they were not "weaklings" by any stretch of the imagination. They were people who, despite the obstacles, held fast to their conviction that the love of God would give them the strength, even in times of weakness, to minister to those entrusted to their care. What wonderful examples we have in these three men. As Saint Paul said, "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me" (2 Corinthians 12:9). When we are feeling that life presents us with too many obstacles, let us remember that even in weakness we can radiate a strength to others that comes from the grace of a God who loves us more and more with each passing day.

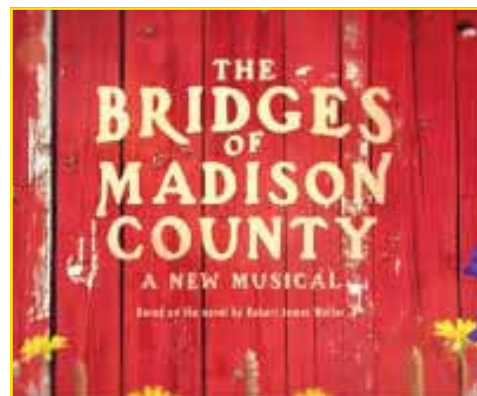

Marriage: The Image of God

This sacrament (Matrimony) leads us to the heart of God's design, which is a plan for a covenant with his people, with us all, a plan for communion. At the beginning of the Book of Genesis, the first book of the Bible, at the culmination of the creation account, it says: "God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them..... Therefore a man leaves his father and mother and cleaves to his wife, and they become one flesh" (Genesis 1:27; 2:24).

The image of God is the married couple: the man and the woman; not only the man, not only the woman, but both of them together. This is the image of God: love, God's covenant with us, is represented in that covenant between man and woman. And this is very beautiful! We are created in order to love, as a reflection of God and his love. And in the marital union, man and woman fulfill this vocation through their mutual reciprocity and their full and definitive communion of life.
