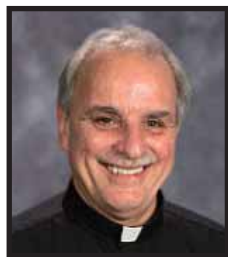

Correction to PSR Sports Eligibility

St. Joseph Parish belongs to MSHSAA (MO State High School Activities Association). Under MSHSAA guidelines, students must participate in athletic programs for their grade level that are provided by the school in which they are enrolled. Specifically...

All students in K-6 may participate in St. Joseph Parish soccer. **All students in grades 5-6** may participate in St. Joseph Parish soccer, volleyball, basketball, and cheerleading. **PSR students in grades 5 - 6** may only play on the B Team. PSR 5th and 6th grade students may not play on the A Team. Playing on the A Team could cause them to become ineligible for all sports in the Middle School. **PSR students grades 7-8** would be eligible to participate in the athletic program offered by Farmington, and therefore ineligible to participate in any areas of St. Joseph Parish Athletics.

All students are eligible to participate in the summer camps sponsored by St. Joseph Parish which encourage enhancement of athletic skills.

INVITE SOMEONE TO BECOME CATHOLIC

Perhaps you know someone who is “seeking” a relationship with God. Why not ask them if they would consider joining the Catholic Church? Invite them to attend RCIA sessions to learn more about the Catholic Community.

INVITE A CATHOLIC TO COMPLETE THEIR SACRAMENTS

Not all baptized Catholics have completed their sacraments of Initiation (Eucharist and/or Confirmation). If you or someone you know would like to step more fully into practice of their Catholic faith RCIA sessions can be just the answer.

COME SERVE IN RCIA MINISTRY

Most people “come to faith” on the “arm of a friend”. Come serve in RCIA ministry as a SPONSOR or another member of the RCIA TEAM. It will make a difference in your life, in your Catholic community’s faith life and it will make a difference in the lives of those on the RCIA journey.

WHAT IS RCIA?

RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a process (often called a “journey of faith”) aimed at welcoming others into our Catholic family through reflection on the experiences of their lives, the messages of sacred Scripture, and the teachings and doctrines of the Catholic Church.

WHO TAKES THIS “FAITH JOURNEY?”

- A. An unbaptized person interested in learning about the Catholic faith
- B. Catholics, who, though baptized, are not catechized and/or did not complete their sacraments of initiation (Eucharist and Confirmation)
- C. Persons baptized in another Christian faith who seek to make a profession of faith in the Catholic tradition and be accepted into full communion of the Catholic Church.

WHAT IF I AM NOT SURE I WANT TO BECOME CATHOLIC BUT WANT TO LEARN ABOUT CATHOLIC TEACHINGS AND PRACTICES?

The RCIA journey respects each participant’s faith experience and their individual faith development timetable. Those “inquiring” into the Catholic faith meet with other inquirers, faith community members, and RICA team members at informal sessions. Friends and family members are also welcome to attend.

WHAT DO YOU “STUDY”?

RCIA is MORE ABOUT FAITH “FORMATION” than information. Resource materials are provided but the “heart” of RCIA is relationship and conversion. It is how we change from behaviors and attitudes which center on self to actions and choices which come from a relationship with a compassionate and loving God.

WHAT DO YOU LEARN ABOUT IN RCIA SESSIONS?

Sessions include topics such as Jesus Christ, the seven sacraments, our Catholic Mass, how we pray, the Church calendar, the Virgin Mary, moral issues/Catholic teachings, the Trinity, the Bible, the Saints, Church history and Catholic tradition.

IS RCIA FOR “RETURNING” CATHOLICS?

Yes, RCIA can be a journey of renewal for everyone in our Catholic community!!! We as a Catholic family are called to look at our own faith formation and spiritual growth as we witness to those who are committed to getting to know us through our worship, outreach, and faith stories.

HOW / WHERE DO I BEGIN THE RCIA PROCESS?

If you are attending mass, have begun to ask yourself, “What do I believe in?” or have already been seeking spiritual direction, then you may have already begun the RCIA faith journey. Come join us. Contact the parish office at 573-756-4250.

TEAM RCIA MINISTRY

The RCIA journey of faith involves several team members who help those on the journey, learn about faith from people who have a relationship with God. Our team members have hearts full of love and an inner desire to share their faith in order to help other on the journey to come to know Jesus.

Focus Equip Website and APP

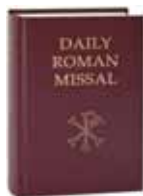

Dynamic Catholic, *Alive!* Grace



Grace is a supernatural gift of God to men and angels for our eternal salvation. The Church makes a distinction between sanctifying grace and actual grace. Sanctifying grace is **"the gratuitous gift that God gives us to make us participants in his Trinitarian life"** (Compendium, 423). It is the permanent disposition (quality, or condition) to live and act in keeping with God's call. Actual grace refers to God's interventions at the beginning of our conversion or along our path to holiness.

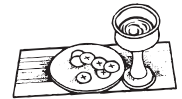

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Tradition is long memory set, not in stone, but in human interaction. Without this active memory, the bonds of relationships and affection fray and fall apart. Communities dissolve as surely as neglected buildings. After participating in events, celebrations, even small rituals, we remark about how good it is to gather and remember.

Today's readings remind us of foundations laid deeper than the human will can relate. Today we learn about God's will to relate to us—to be our God as we are called to be God's own beloved people.

Today in three readings are three ways we remember the covenant bonds that create us as a people and the obligation and responsibility that express the innermost attitude of soul. You are mine. I am yours. These are God's words that created a people as surely as "Let there be light" created the sun and moon and all the stars.

Being

There seem to be myriad ways to follow the covenant and to avoid it. One can turn a relationship with God into mere words. One can make up a set of rules and mistake them for God's law. One can apply the law to everyone but oneself. One can split hairs or lead a double life. Today's readings address all of these subterfuges. They issue an inescapable summons to be a people of integrity. They insist that we see to it that the inner and outer person be one. And the one person, our little selves, must be intimately linked to the Holy One, who is Lord and Father.

Doing

"What is bred in the bone will out in the flesh," as the old saying has it. By and by the heart is worn on the sleeve. The deep self shows up. When the voice of Moses speaks of the covenant, we know he wants to reiterate the law to his people and to all who might hear or see this unique covenanted people. For they have a personal bond with God, and their actions show it. They are what they say—a people actively responsible for their relationships.

And the second reading restates this. There is no wiggle room for a people redeemed in Christ. Religion is "to care for orphans and widows in their affliction" (James 1:27). Thus James instructs us to be in the world, even as we keep clear of its sinful ways.

Jesus, too, replies to the idolatry he sees around him as the learned bow before their own rules and turn them into dogmas. He reminds us all that we must care for the faith-filled inner commitment that constitutes the heart of the covenant. The covenant is a heart-to-heart bond, after all. It is the deepest and most rewarding of bonds.
