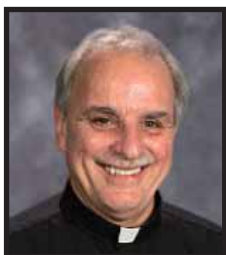

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph,

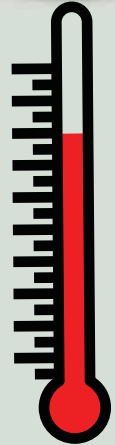

Guidelines:

- Preference will be given to families registered in a parish of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.
- Awards will be granted to new and existing students.
- Awards renew through graduation, upon annual re-qualification and active participation in the Fellows Program.
- Awards transfer should the student transfer to another Catholic school within the Archdiocese.
- Maximum of one Beyond Sunday award per family per school. Families may be eligible for additional scholarship awards from other scholarship-granting organizations.
- Minimum annual tuition payment of \$1,000 per family is required.
- Applicants are required to write a brief essay as part of the Beyond Sunday Fellows application. They must also provide contact information for Catholic and educational leaders who may be contacted to provide a reference.

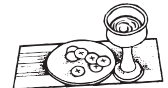

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is doubtful that Paul, when he sat down to write what we now know as the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians, knew that he was penning what was to become one of the keystones of Christian ethics. In this brief passage, he set down ideals about love that have held fast through the centuries. Sometimes we think that because these are ideals that we aspire to, we are excused from them in our daily living.

But what Paul was writing was a letter to his friends, providing them with some sound advice about what it meant—and still means—to live in love, day by day, as a follower of Jesus Christ. We find in his words to his friends a broadening of the great commands of Jesus to love God and neighbor. Today we hear what this love must look like in our own actions, and how it ought to guide our relationships with others.

Famous First Words . . .

Today's readings are filled with some of the phrases from the scriptures that have become some of the best-known and best-loved: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you" (Jeremiah 1:4), "Put aside childish things" (1 Corinthians 13:11), "No prophet is accepted in his own native place" (Luke 4:24). All three come from books of the scripture that bear the names of God's messengers, all of whom have one thing in common. Jeremiah, Paul, and Jesus began their ministries with enthusiasm and energy, but soon encountered opposition. Nonetheless, we still know their words and lives, and so they provide inspiration and hope for us to continue doggedly on with the mission or ministry—whatever it may be—which God has granted us. Will living the life to which God calls us be easy and perfectly smooth? Of course not! Do we have reason to continue on in faith? Of course!



And Last Things

All three of these figures, in the course of their mission, endured trial, hardship, and ultimately, death. Jesus, especially when speaking of his fate to suffer, quotes Jeremiah more than any other prophet. And it is the death of Jesus on the cross that Luke once again foretells in his passage today. Though the Nazarenes would have had to lead Jesus a long, long way to a hill (Nazareth is a very flat place), his concern is not geography, but destiny. This passage looks forward to the time when Jesus, rejected by his own, will be "cast out" not just from a city, but from Israel itself. Once again it will take place on a hill, where he will die on a cross. But our own hope of overcoming adversity is also foreshadowed today when Jesus passes through their midst, as he will pass through the clutches of death. How blessed are we, then, to have Jeremiah, Paul, and Jesus to guide us and offer us strength to persevere in our own call to be faithful to God's will for us.
