

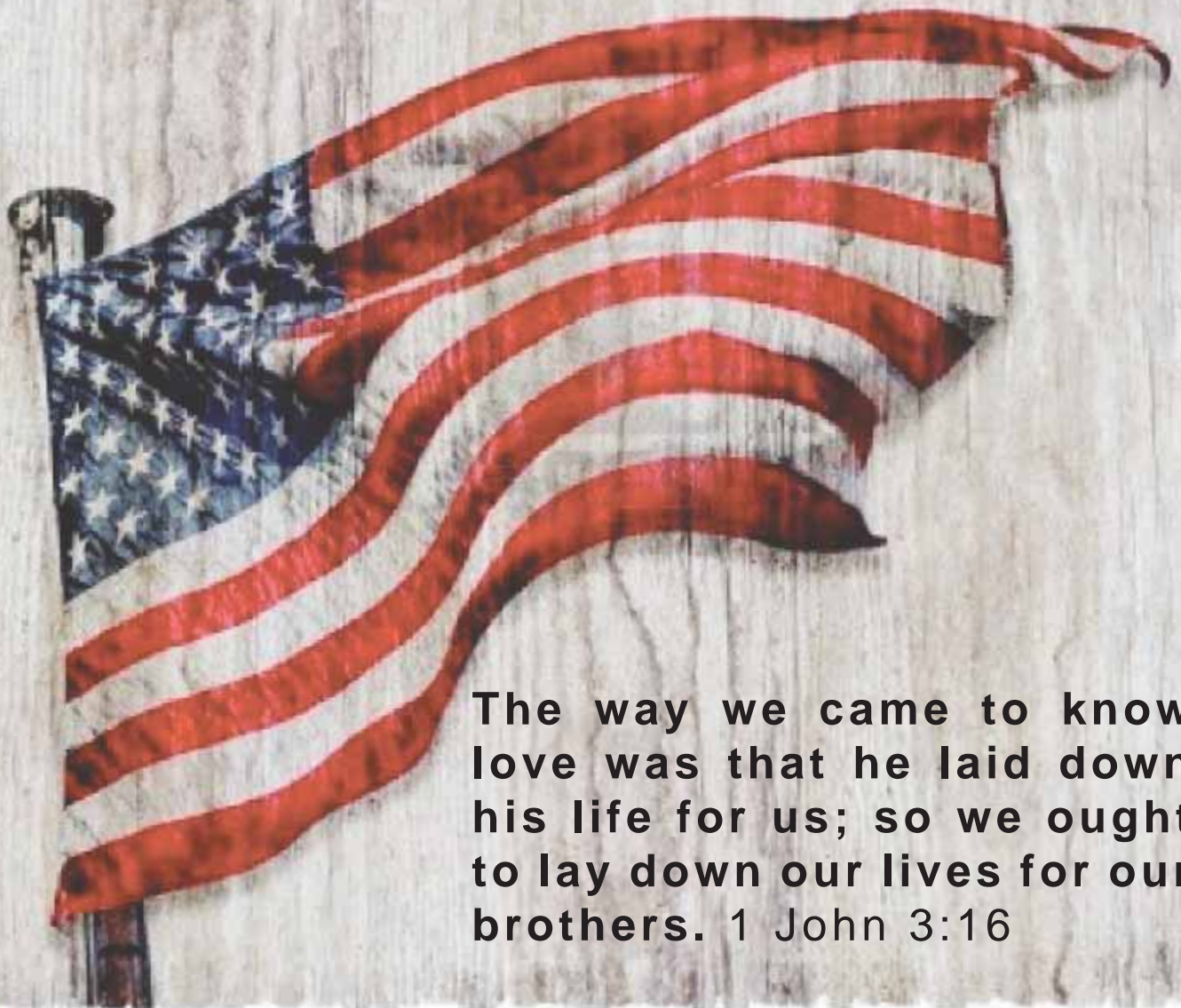

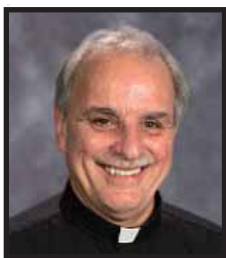

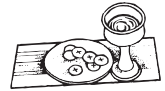

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Each of the readings includes a blessing and a sharing of food. They remind us of the central place of meals in our lives. Each meal brings to mind other meals: the sharing of cookies and milk, pizza and beer, loaves and fishes, bread and wine. When we prepare a meal for our family, our friends, even strangers, we always put something of ourselves into the preparation and the meal itself. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us of what God put into the preparation for this meal that we celebrate today. We share this sacred meal and are transformed as we remember the death of Jesus and the sacrifice that nurtures our faith, sustains our lives, and supports our work.

The Makings Of A Meal

In Genesis, it's an intimate gathering. Melchizedek, both a king and a priest, blesses Abram, a man chosen by God, using the simple food and drink of ordinary meals. Abram's response is to offer God a part, ten percent, of everything he has. In Corinthians, Paul remembers the gathering of friends and family, the blessing of bread and wine at the meal the night before Jesus died. Jesus gave, not just part of everything he had, but all he was: his Body and Blood. In Luke, the meal is large, unplanned, and most there are strangers. Jesus' response is simple, "Feed them." The Apostles, overwhelmed by the number of people and their scant resources, don't know what to do. But Jesus, taking what is available, two loaves and five fishes, offers a blessing and there is more than enough.

The Makings Of A Life

Growing up, my family said grace before each meal, recognizing that what nourished us came from the work and sacrifice of other hands, those who grew the crops and those who prepared them for eating. We asked for a blessing on the fruits of those who labored. We recognized that even the simplest meal comes from the bounty of God through the sacrifice of Jesus. It is the blessing that transforms each of these meals and the participants. The value of the nourishment, bodily or spiritual, is blessed, remembered, and celebrated. Abram, Paul, and Jesus understood where our nourishment comes from. Our lives are nourished in body, mind, and spirit by the sacrifice of others. Today, and with every meal, we remember and bless the sacrifice of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, who gave his all that we might be saved and transformed.

"The Virtue of Chastity and its Effects on Abortion "

Chastity, as defined in the Merriam Webster dictionary, is “the state of not having sex with anyone; the quality or state of being chaste.” These days a lot of people think it is not a big deal to wait to have sex until marriage. Many products are advertised by catching a person’s attention with sexual images. The question to present-day advertisers is, what are you really selling? Are you selling perfume, or are you selling that it is perfectly fine to go ahead and have sex? If people were to practice chastity, the need for abortion would be reduced, if not altogether eliminated.

According to the Merriam Webster dictionary, abortion is “a medical procedure used to end a pregnancy and cause the death of the fetus.” The main cause of abortions is an unplanned and/or an unwanted pregnancy. I do not think most women truly realize that when they are pregnant and plan on getting an abortion, they are killing a human being. At just fifteen weeks a baby is the size of an apple, can control his or her own muscles, and can even move. When someone is getting an abortion, she probably is not thinking of the child as a human but as an unfortunate mistake. If a child is aborted, his or her life, as well as what he or she could have accomplished, is taken away. The child could have done great things and made a difference in some way, but when the child is aborted, all of this potential is taken away.

Approximately forty-two million abortions worldwide take place each year. According to a study done in 2012 by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, 437,000 people were killed worldwide. Including the number of children aborted, imagine how many lives and opportunities were taken away. This is just one effect of not practicing chastity.

In conclusion, when one practices chastity, the need for an abortion is virtually eliminated. What better effect can there be?

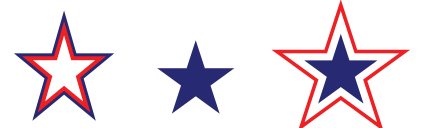
