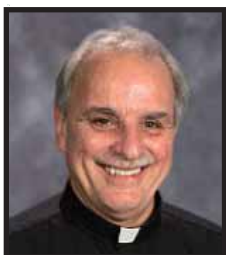

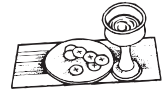

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, How am I present to God and others in my life?

Jesus Christ, Superstar

Imagine how you would feel if a very famous person asked you to stand right by her side during a highly publicized funeral. Calling on you in her time of greatest suffering and vulnerability, she asks you to share in her suffering. As media reports on the tragedy roll in, every photograph shows you standing side by side with your famous friend, grieving together. In the midst of sadness, you would probably feel honored to serve as such a close and trusted companion.

Jesus asks something like this from us. From time to time, the Lord asks us to accompany him in suffering. Often we postpone or reject the invitation, though, preferring health, security, and prosperity. God provides all good things, but here for a little while we are sometimes asked to suffer. And who asks us? Needy family members, people who are homeless, refugees drinking contaminated water, children with special needs, irritating coworkers—all of these people are stand-ins for Jesus, asking us to suffer with him.



Jesus Knows Our Hearts

Abraham and Martha show us how to get busy tending to others' needs. Abraham orders up an impressive menu of fine food, selecting his best animal to slaughter and prepare. Abraham's visitors appreciate his attentive hospitality and reward him with long-awaited good news. When Martha bustles about preparing for her guest, however, she receives a gentle scolding. Jesus, who knows our hearts, senses anxiety, perhaps bitterness, in Martha.

Despite her good deeds, Martha pays more attention to her sister than to her guest. Our attention to Jesus is the one thing necessary. If anger, jealousy, or resentment distracts us from serving Jesus, then our work is empty. Saint Paul confirms this when he invites the Colossians to offer all their daily activities, even their suffering, to the Lord. The only thing lacking in Jesus' suffering is our own free choice to pay attention to him and share his suffering.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults



The process of entering the Catholic Faith and becoming a member here at St. Joseph's is one that has long been used throughout the history of the Church. This process is called RCIA or the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. ***Are you a former Catholic looking to come home? Are you interested in learning more about becoming Catholic? If so, please contact us today!***

RCIA at St. Joseph is a faith journey providing an opportunity to grow and deepen in faith while discovering how God is active in everyday life. Whether a person has a strong faith with a lot of religious formation or none at all, RCIA is a chance to learn more about the Catholic Church. Participants in RCIA, through sharing and discussion about Catholic beliefs and practices, learn about the Catholic Church.

The RCIA process includes presentations, sharing, and questions and answers about the Church and its beliefs, sacraments, traditions, customs and symbols. It is a requirement for all participants in the RCIA to have a sponsor who is willing to accompany them through this process. This personal sponsor (a spouse, friend, or relative) must be a practicing Catholic. If a personal sponsor does not meet this requirement or if the person does not want to choose a personal sponsor, arrangements will be made for a parish sponsor.

Catechumens and Candidates

Those who are not baptized are called, "Catechumens". They begin meeting in the Pre-catechumenate studying topics on Christianity, Catholicism, and Scripture. These sessions are held to help prepare the catechumens for entering sessions in preparation for the celebration of the Initiation Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Those who are baptized in another Christian tradition are called "Candidates". At the Easter Vigil, the candidates make a Profession of Faith, receive First Communion and Confirmation in the Catholic Church.



Those individuals baptized Catholic who have not experienced any religious instruction in the faith and who are seeking to receive their First Communion and/or Confirmation will also join the RCIA process before receiving Sacraments. The RCIA process is designed to respect the dignity of all Baptisms and the value of all religious backgrounds. In the RCIA process participants will meet and get to know others who are on their "spiritual journey" while involved in the RCIA journey.

Opportunities for Spiritual Growth

RCIA is a process that provides basic information about Christianity and the Catholic Church. In addition it provides an opportunity to experience a Catholic Christian community worshipping, praising, sharing, socializing and fellowship. The community journeys together, learning and educating themselves on their life-long journey, seeking to know God better and to develop a love relationship with God.

RCIA Meeting Schedule

The RCIA sessions are held every Thursday evening in the Parish Center starting at 6:00 pm with a meal provided. These sessions are held September through Easter and Pentecost.

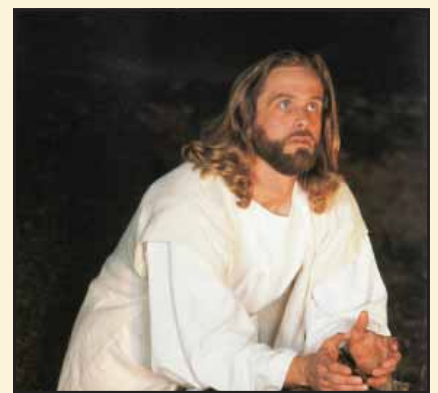
