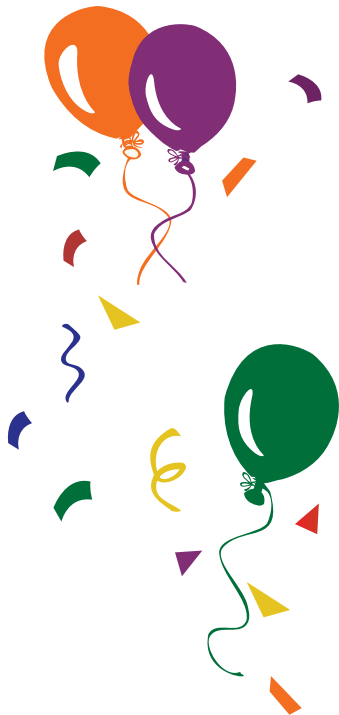

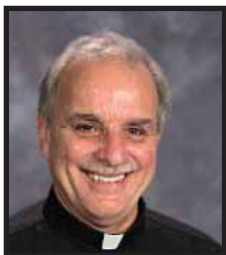

## From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph

### Some Health News to Share with You...

For the past few weeks, you may have noticed my absence at our weekend masses. I wish I could tell you that I was away and enjoying some quality time on cruise ship or better yet, enjoying some quality time in the rocking chair on the front porch at the farm.... but instead I have been struggling with some health issues.

For the past year or so, you may have noticed that I've been having some problems while celebrating Mass. While I was standing at mass, I was experiencing dizziness or the medical term vertigo, but the problem continued to get more progressive.... Some of you noticed during the past few months that I was unable to lift the paten and chalice during the mass. While standing, I was experiencing a drop in my blood pressure. When this was happening, I felt my head spinning and felt like I was falling. You also may have noticed that I was hugging the altar and was not able to free stand. I would be totally exhausted at the end of mass with dangerously high blood pressure.

When I passed out during the Paul VI class this past November, I began seeing my doctor more frequently, I was especially having problems with high blood pressure. The problems during Mass were becoming more difficult, even to the point where I could not celebrate the morning masses, for I would feel totally exhausted. I continued pushing myself to celebrate masses on weekends, unaware what I was doing to my body. The last two weeks I was just physically unable to celebrate the Mass.

I am under the care of some exceptional doctors, and have been to a heart specialist where I have received the assurance that luckily, my heart was in good shape and the problems were not coming from a heart issue.

I will be seeing a vascular neurologist specialist at Barnes this week and hoping to share with you next week what I learn. In the meantime, under my doctor's advice, I will not be offering any masses or be doing any kind of strenuous work. I have been asked

not to drive, so I will not be able to make any home visits, communion calls, or much of anything. Really bummed that I cannot get away for a few days of scheduled vacation to the farm. At this time, I am staying close to the rectory until we can figure out what exactly is going on.

**My sincere thanks to Fr. Abe, Fr. John Schneider and Fr. Jim Dyer for so faithfully helping out with the weekend mass schedule. My thanks to our awesome staff who have been extremely supportive and encouraging during this time. My thanks also to those who have dropped off a meal or cookies not knowing what was really going on.**

Please keep me in your prayers and I will give you an update when I learn more. I am so blessed to be your pastor! Without a doubt, whatever is discovered, I know I'll be in good hands in your prayers! I am right where God wants me to be, in the warmth of the heart of St. Joseph's parish!

I was out of town attending a family reunion.

After about an hour and half, he was finally able to get someone's attention who called the cops! Believe it or not, this has happened before, I once locked the doors on a visitor from Louisiana! She was locked inside for more than three hours before we found her!

## A Message from Fr. Abe...

### TRINITY: GOD IS CREATOR, SAVIOR AND SANCTIFIER

Today is Trinity Sunday. We proclaim the truth that **God is ONE with THREE DIVINE PERSONS: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit [Mt 28:19]**. It's difficult to comprehend. We are one being and person but, God is One being and Three distinct Persons. How did it happen? Only God knows. It's a mystery, something that we know, but can't fully understand; like a child staring at the vast sky or ocean. We know what and who God is, because He revealed Himself in our history. So instead of focusing on God's nature, let's take a closer look at His 'actions' through which He presented Himself in an understandable manner:

**The Creator [The Father]. God is Father [Mt 6:9], the origin of life and existence [Ps 8:3].** St. Thomas Aquinas explains that everything has a cause. In the world there are motions, everything is set in order. There is degree of perfection in the universe and planets that are governed by natural law. The cause of beings, the mover of the world, the order of planetary systems, the criterion of beauty and the governor of the cosmos is a Person who is our Father. **All biological fatherhood merely mirrors Him who is the source of all fatherhood [Eph 3:15].**

**The Redeemer [The Son]. Sin is in our flesh, burning in our hearts every day [Rom 3:23].** Satan and his minions are always giving us temptations. All are troubled by guilt and wounded by sins. In our weakness, we find strength in God who is our Savior. **This Redeemer, who saves us from sin, is a Person who died for us: Jesus [Jn 3:16]. The Lord teaches us: God is greater than our sins [cf. Rom 5:20/1 Jn 3:20].**

**The Sanctifier [The Spirit]. In human life, there is always a struggle between good and evil [Eph 6:11].** Confronted by evil, God is a Person who guides us to Holiness, but the Sanctifier gives us graces and virtues to conform to His image. **He gives us new birth [Jn 3:6-8], comfort [Jn 14:18], and teach us how to pray [Rom 8:26]. "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" [Gal 5:22-23].**

**The Trinity reveals God is love [1 Jn 4:8].** God creates, saves and makes holy by which we became partakers of His divine life. What an awesome God we serve.

c. Details: Bright Start beneficiaries (i.e. children with special needs) will be given free occupational therapy consultation and home instruction program as well as financial assistance for medications, vitamins. Grocery items will be given to them and their families.

It's summer here in the Philippines and it's a summer of love because once again, thru your donations, we have assisted children with disabilities. And we are happy to inform you that we have new Bright Start Angels. We have new recipients from Kinatarcan Island, Sta. Fe. Cebu.

Furthermore, I am also glad to share with you that this summer was especially heartwarming. We received a letter of request from the mother of Clark Quinatadcan (see attached pictures) last April 2017. He was a former student of Lahug Elementary School (i.e. the school being supported by Bright Start). He is also a registered Person With Disability (PWD). The family had (and is having) financial difficulties but since he graduated high school with honors, he was able to get a scholarship for college. With determination to finish, he was able to do it. But graduation fees were beyond their reach. As such, they asked for help from different agencies. But to no avail. Her former teacher and special education head, Mrs. Gina Labrador, suggested Bright Start. Long story short, we did not hesitate to help. And of course, we could not do it without your generous donation.

May our good Lord continue to bless you with good health Fr. Rickey. Much love to all.


