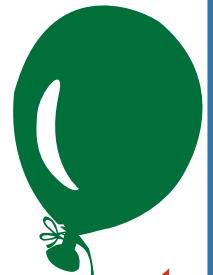

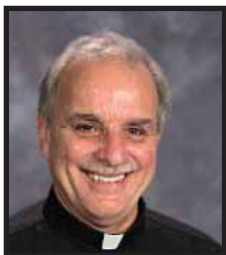

A Message from Fr. Abe...

EUCHARIST: THE HEART OF THE CHURCH

The Eucharist is the summit of our faith [CCC#1327]. Jesus is present in the Eucharist body, soul and divinity. By the power of Christ's Words [Institution Narrative] and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit [Epiclesis] during the Holy Mass, the substance of bread and wine transforms [Transubstantiation] into the Body and Blood of Christ [CCC#1333]. **Thus, it's the true manna from heaven, the Bread of Life [Jn 6:51] and Chalice of Salvation [Ps 116:12-13].** The Eucharist is the Lord's greatest gift for His Bride [The Church]. He instituted and handed it over to the Apostles [cf. 1 Cor 11:23], thus, Divine and Apostolic in origin. **The Eucharist is the heart of the Church from very beginning [cf. Acts 2:46].**

The Eucharist is prefigured in the Old Testament. First, the offering of bread and wine by the priest-king, Melchizedek, [Gen 14:18] foreshadows the priesthood of Christ [cf. Heb 5:5-6]. The Lord chose the priesthood of Melchizedek when He consecrated the bread and wine into His Body and Blood in the Last Supper, wherein He ordained the Apostles as priests by Divine Command: **"Do this in Remembrance of Me" [Lk 22:19/1 Cor 11:24].** By this, Jesus changed the priesthood from Levitical Order back into the more ancient Order of Melchizedek [cf. Heb 7:12]. Thus, burnt offerings ceased, replaced by the Holy Mass. Secondly, the Showbread in the Tabernacle must be on the Sanctuary Table always [Ex 25:30]. It is a Holy Bread [1 Sam 21:4-6] and 'unleavened' [1 Chron 23:29]. In Jerusalem Temples, the Showbread is put on the Altar of gold [1 Kgs 7:48/1 Chron 28:16].

In New Testament, the Showbread is recounted on the Altar Table with seven candles [Heb 9:2]. St. John described the adoration of the Lamb as the "standing golden altar" [Rev 8:3-5], obviously the heavenly worship of Christ [Lamb] in Eucharistic manner. Catholics do the same Adoration by showing the Bread of Life to the faithful through a Monstrance. Each time we see the Holy Eucharist, every Catholic heart exclaims: **"My Lord and my God" [Jn 20:28].** In Eucharistic Processions, we commemorate Jesus' journey with disciples from Jerusalem to Emmaus [cf. Lk 24:13-34], inspiring them through the Scriptures and Bread of Thanksgiving [Eucharistia]. So, Procession begins in the Church [New Jerusalem] and back to the same Church, because **Jesus remains with His Bride, the Church, forever through the Eucharist [cf. Mt 28:20].**



"Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." 1 CORINTHIANS 10:17

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to lead holy lives and invite others to join us. Living a stewardship lifestyle, being grateful and generous with our gifts, serves a twofold purpose. One, it helps build God's kingdom here on earth. Two, it is a road map to Heaven. Let's help each other get there!
