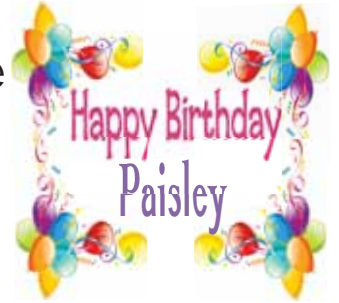

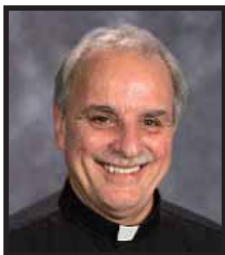

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph

A Special Mass and Anointing of the Sick for our Sick, Elderly, and Homebound

On **Wednesday, November 8** at 10:00 am we will have our **annual Anointing of the Sick Mass** and will offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to all parishioners who are in need of healing.

A quote from the General Introduction to the ritual itself, **Pastoral Care of the Sick**, explains more: "Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. Christians feel and experience pain as do all other people; yet their faith helps them to grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering and to bear their pain with greater courage. From Christ's words they know that sickness has meaning and value for their own salvation and the salvation of the world. They also know that Christ, who during his life often visited and healed the sick, loves them in their illness."

It is Christ who bestows the Anointing upon them.

Our 8th grade students will be invited to serve as hospitality ministers and will also help to host the luncheon chaired by our Women of Mary that will follow in our Parish Center. 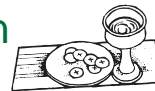

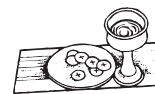

A Message from Fr. Abe...

TO LOVE GOD WITH ALL OUR HEART

The History of Salvation started at the very beginning of creation. Our First Parents were given by God life, existence, intelligence, freedom and the entire world for possession and yet they were not satisfied: they wanted to be 'Gods'. In effect, they suffered physical and spiritual death. Instead of being grateful to the Almighty for all their blessings they sought happiness outside of God rather than 'in' God. **In our Gospel [Mt 22:34-40], Jesus is teaching us to love God with all our heart, soul and mind. Jesus doesn't want us to fall like our First Parents and so He reminds us to put God first in our life so that by doing so we can gain eternal life.** Only in God can we find the genuine meaning of life and everlasting happiness because we came from Him.

There are four channels of love. The **heart** stands for our emotions; the **soul** for our will and general individuality; the **mind** for our intellect; and **strength** for the activities and energies of our service. By the heart Jesus wants us to establish the deepest relationship with God at all times, through happiness and pain. By our soul Jesus wants us to use our freedom to choose God above all things and forge our personal identity with Him. By the mind Jesus wants us to use our intellect to seek God and to find ways to honor Him through the power of our intellect. Then, by strength Jesus wants us to give our best in everything we do; give glory to God whose image we bear and made us stewards of creation by the works of our hands.

Loving God above all else and total surrender to His benevolent love should come naturally to each of us because we are created in His image and likeness. Unfortunately, we were told by unbelieving educational systems to seek and impose our own "self" in everything: what I want and long for, rather than God's will. Let us return to the pure spirituality of our childhood and consecrate ourselves totally to Christ our God and King, through prayer of Consecration: **"O Lord Jesus, I give myself entirely to You. To show my devotion I offer You my whole being without reserve. Since I'm Yours, defend and protect me as your property and possession. Amen."**



"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind." - MATTHEW 22:37
