For the past ten years as your pastor, I've been very blessed with the vibrant lay leadership of our parish. The documents of Vatican II state that the Church is both a sign of our unity with God and an instrument for achieving that unity. The responsibility accomplishing this task is shared equally by all members of the faith community, both the clergy and laity. A Pastoral Council, formerly known as a Parish Council, is a visionary body. Representatives of the parish foster the full participation of the entire parish in the life and mission of the parish and of the Universal Church by setting parish direction, planning, and visioning. This body is advisory to the Pastor. Our council is comprised of members of our parish who then serve on four steering committees.

- 4) Our pastoral council is **collaborative**; it challenges its members, the parish staff, committees, organizations and other groups within the parish to work together. It then seeks ways to collaborate with other parishes, community organizations and congregations to foster the common good of the broader community.

PSR Open House Begins with Rosary Next Wednesday, September 2



Parish Missionary **Disciples**



Session 2, April 2015



The second month of our Disciple Makers training focused mainly on three subjects. First was a tool called the Discipleship Road Map. The Road Map has 5 different categories to gauge where you are in your discipleship journey with Christ. Are you a Beginning Disciple or a Spiritual Multiplier? We discussed with a partner, and then with the team, our rating. Being honest to yourself and the group about where you stand on the Map can be a humbling experience...you realize there is much room for improvement.

The second subject was Prayer. As in most of the training you have to ask yourself (and others) questions you don't consciously think about most of the time: What is Prayer? When do you pray? How did you learn to pray? How and when did Jesus Pray? The Saints were used to provide several different explanations of prayer. Again, we engaged with a classmate to explain how we pray and then discussed prayer with our Parish team. We were introduced to Lectio Divino (Divine Reading) as a prayerful way of opening the Word every day. It consists of 4 Movements:

- 1. Read.....Listen for the still small voice of God that will speak to us personally a word today.
- 2. <u>Meditate</u>.....Invitation to be like the Virgin Mary "pondering in her heart" what she saw and heard of Christ (Luke 2:19).
- 3. Pray.....We allow the Word that we have taken in and on which we are pondering to touch and change our deepest selves.
- **4. Contemplate**....Simply rest in the presence of the God who loves us.

We then spent 30 minutes in Adoration at the Chapel in the Rigali Center and were challenged to invite another to Adoration with us at St. Joseph.

Our last subject was learning how to lead small groups in Bible study and prayer. One member of each team switched to another table and led that group in a short Bible study session. There is no chance to be an introvert in these classes! Everyone is engaged at some point.

So far the Discipleship classes have allowed us to view St. Joseph Parish from a very different perspective, to see our strengths and weaknesses and determine where change is needed and ultimately to help mold all of the Parish to become more involved in their Discipleship journey with Christ!



What is Lectio Divino?


- Receptivity instead of activity

In The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic, Matthew Kelly wonders: "When was the last time you consciously sat down and explored God's will for a

What is a "Parish Missionary Disciple"?

Parish.

Let's take a look at each of these three words. The first is Parish.

At our first Parish Missionary Disciple session last March, we were asked to estimate how many people were in our parish and challenged to look beyond just registered parishioners. *In actuality, we are responsible for every person within our parish boundaries, most of St. Francois County!* This definitely sheds new light on what our parish is and could be!

Missionary.

In the past most people thought of a missionary as those people who would travel across the world to help those in need and minister to the people who had never been told about the Good News of Jesus Christ. Times have changed and we don't need to travel very far to see that there are many people in our own communities and parish who need to hear The Good News again!

The key to this is being intentional. We have to intentionally go out and meet people where they are. At work, sports practices, meetings, dinners, on the streets, at Wal-Mart, etc. these are all places where we are asked to spread the Good News and our love for Jesus Christ.

Disciple.

Me?... A disciple? That does not sound right. It feels a little too...evangelical or protestant. Although, it is rather simple: The command, to "go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19), has been the same since the Great Commission and has never changed! By our baptism, we are all called to be disciples!







Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time


Wisdom is imagined as a woman rich in poise and grace. She moves smoothly and confidently about her temple-like home. She doesn't flutter about, nervous with worry. Wisdom sends her maidens to invite all to her open house. The guests do not possess any particular genius or insight. They need only be people of good will and common sense. They are summoned to leave behind foolishness and to find for themselves a place at Wisdom's table. There they may eat and drink deeply.

Today's Gospel draws us back to the table of the Eucharist. Jesus addresses those who seek to understand his words and, sadly, those who seek to avoid them. As people born of God, we are called and equipped to seek God's will and act on it.

A Whole Life

We expect and find in Jesus a great tenderness when he addresses the wounded, bewildered, and fearful. He bends down to them, as the greater bend to the lesser. But here Jesus is faced not with the doubtful and anguished, but with the murmurers whose questions are edgy and obtuse. Theirs are not the questions of those who seek a deep understanding, but those who seek to condemn and find fault.

In today's Gospel, Jesus addresses those who would rather not come to dinner. For their choice to do so just might require the daily conversion of which the second reading speaks. They will also miss the joy that marks the community of the Resurrection. This joy is



based on faith. But this joy is also drawn from the very people with whom we celebrate, from whom we ask forgiveness, with whom we work day in and day out. The Eucharistic celebration gives a taste of the full life that the Holy Spirit gives to all who gather in the Lord.

Jesus speaks of the kind of life that leads to life eternal. He does not soften his words or make his invitation pretty and easy. He speaks on a grand scale. He asks of us a largeness of soul. He is passionate about this. Something great is at stake here, something that will require the commitment and promise of a whole life.

Without End

In assembling this Gospel, the community of John set forth its clear understanding of the Eucharist. A refusal to share in Jesus' life is a refusal to share in his life with the Father. This life begins in the Eucharist and has no end. Jesus' generous offer of his own life for us still stands. The invitation issued by Wisdom reaches its fullness in this Gospel. We are invited to share this bread come down from heaven. We are invited to live today and forever. Amen.





New to our Parish?

You enter this Church not as a stranger, but as a guest of God. As a baptized person, you enter it as a son or daughter of the Father in Christ. This House of God, therefore, is your family home. 
