





A Letter from Fr. Abe...

Arrival Message To The Faithful Of St. Joseph By Fr. Abe Arganiosa



My dear brothers and sisters of St. Joseph Parish in Farmington.

This is **Rev. Fr. Abe Arganiosa**, a 47 year old priest from San Jose del Monte City, Philippines and for the past 4 years is serving in the Archdiocese of St. Louis first as sacramental minister of St. Andrew Catholic Church in Lemay Ferry and as Associate Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Valley Park.

Through the grace of God I've been appointed by our **Archbishop Robert J. Carlson** as your associate pastor to continue the works of **Fr. Jim Dyer** our beloved associate who is retiring from active ministry. The news brought me joy and excitement because our Parish is such a beautiful and historic church and the Catholics of Farmington bear witness to its dynamic faith. However, at the same time I received the news with fear and trembling because I am a foreigner called to serve in such a wonderful and active Christian community. I am humbled by the Lord's call and the Archbishop's generosity. My consolation so far is the divine promise that those who trust in Jesus shall never be disenchanted; that those who put their hope in His love shall fly like the Eagle [cf. Is 40:31], shall speak to foreign men and they will understand, and that through you I shall behold the face of God and live. It helps too that I've already met our Pastor **Fr. Rickey J. Valleroy** and he's been so friendly and accepting. The same goodness I have experienced from Fr. Jim and our Office Staff. I have seen in them and through them genuine love... and such a love casts away all fears [cf. 1 Jn 4:18].

I am coming to help and support Fr. Rickey in his pastoral program and to learn from his treasury of wisdom and pastoral experience. I am coming to serve. I am but a simple servant hoping that in such humble service you will be strengthened in Christ. We shall pray together, we shall worship together and together we shall build The Body of Christ in Farmington.

Almost 16 years ago on December 28, 2000 of the Great Jubilee I was ordained a priest in my home church the Sto. Rosario Parish. I was then a young religious under the Somascan Fathers Congregation [CRS: Clerics Regular of Somascha] founded by St. Jerome Emiliani (1486-1527) and canonically approved by Pope St. Pius V in 1561. Since that grace-filled day of December 2000 I had experienced to be administrator in an institute for Orphans and Needy Youth, College and High School Chaplain as well as teacher and media evangelizer in our local radio and TV in the Philippines. My thirst for parish pastoral ministry led me to the Archdiocese of St. Louis for which I am now in the process of Incardination.

Like the Magi and St. Peter I can come from afar... from the East. I come knocking at the door of your heart begging to please let me in as a friend and brother in Christ. Please do not look at the color of my skin and the unique sound of my voice but in the beauty of faith that we commonly share. With the ancient mystic I sing before you: "Set me as a seal in your heart, as a seal in your arms" [cf. Song 8:6]. Having this spiritual reflection at heart I am very eager to be home with you. Here I am O Lord, I come to do Your will [cf. Heb 10:9]. Here I am St. Joseph Catholic Church ready to serve. I consecrate myself and our Parish to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and entrust this ministry to the protection of St. Michael the Archangel. Blessed be the Name of the Lord now and forever. Amen.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings celebrate God's providence. No matter how wonderful (or heartbreaking) our relationships are, God always provides for us. No one cares for us the way God does.

Isaiah delights us with a deeply intimate image of God caring for us "as a mother comforts her child." The prophet describes us not as the usual "children of God," but as "babies." We should not resist this image, but rejoice in it. Trusting in God's care, we can all let down our guard and rest like infants in the lap of our mother.

Saint Paul's trust in God allows him to be at peace like this. He boldly declares that no one can "make troubles" for him, because he has given himself completely to Jesus. And when Jesus sends his disciples out to preach and heal, he challenges them not to provide for themselves, but to let faith be their guide.

Never Alone

Saint Paul reminds us today that he "bears the marks of Jesus" on his body. We recall another letter in which Paul describes his imprisonments and beatings: "Five times at the hands of the Jews I received forty lashes minus one. Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, I passed a night and a day on the deep" (2 Corinthians 11:24–25). Far from being bitter about all this abuse, Paul "boasts" in the cross that Jesus has allowed him to share.

Those of us who have a scar usually have a memorable story about what caused the injury. Paul's scars remind him of his life in Christ. With the marks of Jesus on his body and the love of Christ in his heart, Paul is never alone.

Deeply Connected

We are never alone, not really. We live in relationships, in community. That's the way we come into the world, after all, with a mother laboring to deliver us into the human community. God—being Father, Son, Holy Spirit—is a mysterious community who intends us to live in relationship with God and others, always and forever. Stories of abandonment or abuse affect us strongly precisely because we all know the deep human need to be embraced by a loving family.

Our reading from Isaiah today describes God as a gentle mother, playing with us, her children, and comforting us. This same God who cares for us so intimately chose to enter our human family through Mary. Jesus, her son, grew strong in her care. And, as Luke tells us today, when the time came to spread his gospel message, Jesus insisted on community: he sent his disciples in pairs.

The instructions Jesus gives his seventy-two missionaries reinforce the importance of community. Jesus wants his disciples to build healthy relationships wherever they go, wishing peace on new acquaintances, sharing gifts of healing and faith, and graciously accepting hospitality in whatever form it is offered. These practical tips still apply to us today, modern disciples of Jesus at work in the world.
