It will do great work, if I work.

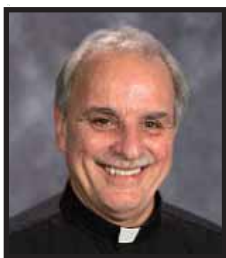
It will make generous gifts to many causes,


## Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers.

### Unless We Become Like Children

Elsewhere in Luke's Gospel Jesus tells us we must become like children to enter the kingdom of God. Today's Gospel gives us a practical example of how to become childlike: ask questions, and expect answers. We need to ask as many questions as the neediest, most inquisitive children we know. Moreover, like babies, we need to expect to be cared for. Jesus models this for us, going so far as to let us call God our own Father. The Our Father prayer that Jesus teaches us asks God for many things: a divine plan for our world, daily sustenance, forgiveness, help, and protection. Jesus invites us to ask for these things over and over again. He promises that God will always listen and honor our prayers.



And I tell you,  
*Ask*  
 and you will receive;  
*Seek*  
 and you will find;  
*Knock*  
 and the door will be  
 opened to you.

Of course, sometimes babies and children ask for things that aren't in their best interest, like a third candy bar or a real sword. Like children, we can expect to feel disappointed from time to time when it seems that God has refused to answer our prayers. In those moments, we can remember, like Abraham, that we are but "dust and ashes." We can be confident that the "judge of all the world" will act with justice for the good of humanity.

### Mercy Shock

It's true that God always answers our prayers, and sometimes in good and grand ways we don't expect. It's also true that God answers prayers we've never uttered. God gives us things we don't even know to ask for. Saint Paul meditates on the very best gift God ever offered us: salvation. Jesus suffered, died for us, and rose from the dead, and we had no idea what he was doing. Without our realizing it, our own sinful debt was bought and paid for by Jesus. That's the shocking thing about mercy: God offers it even when we don't know we need it. God works for our good even if we never say thank you. Sharing in the Eucharist today is the very best way to thank God now.

## A Message from Fr. Abe...

### God, The Source Of All Fatherhood

In our Gospel Jesus revealed the heart of God by introducing Him as 'Abba' [Father]. Through this generous revelation we received the most beautiful prayer the 'Our Father'. However, some find it difficult to understand.

The term 'father' reminds us of patriarchal dynasties of the past and the failures of many men to live their responsibilities to be a loving father. There are abusive fathers and others even refuse to claim paternity of their own children.

St. Paul, however, explains to us that the Fatherhood of God was not patterned after human fathers but the other way around. Our human fathers are called such because they are living manifestations of the One and True and Perfect Father who is the source of all fatherhood whether on heaven or on earth [cf. Eph 3:15].

God is a Spirit. He doesn't have the physical attributes of a biological father or mother. He is called 'Father' because of the following reasons: First, He is the origin and source of life as our fathers are the initiator of the act of planting the seed of life. Second, He is our 'Divine Provider'. He doesn't leave us weak. He sustains us with air, water, food and sunlight and everything necessary to live. Finally, He gives us His Spirit [cf. Gen 2:7/ Rom 8:15] not only to conform us to His image but also to empower with grace to live a life worthy of Him... to share His eternal life.

Let us give thanks to God for being a loving and merciful Father [cf. Eph 2:4] and let us pray for our Dads that despite their imperfections they will be loving and caring as our Heavenly Father.

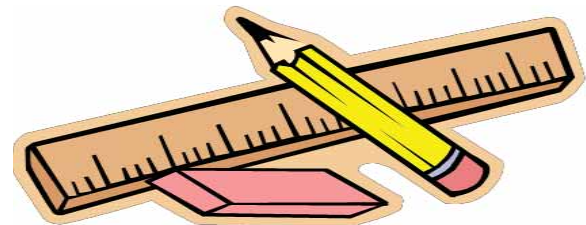

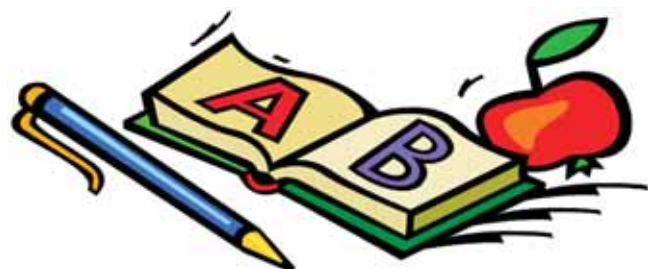

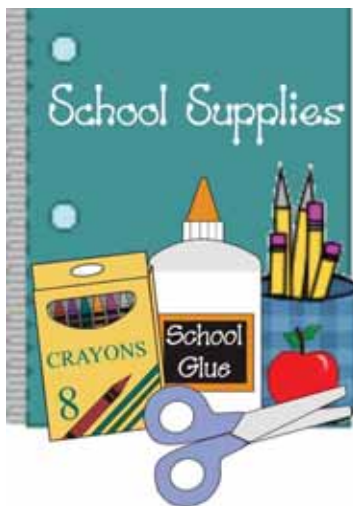
