## A Note from St. Joseph's Finance Committee

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph's,

As our pastor often begins his announcements in his weekly column, we too would like to begin with "it is with great joy" that we present you with the past year's financial fiscal report. **Thank you for your time, treasure and talents as faithful stewards this past year.** The following is a summarization of information supplied to us by the Archdiocesan Accounting Office. **As you can see from the subsequent financial report, God has truly blessed our parish again this year.** Our parish closed the year with a positive balance of **\$15,669.00**. This amount does not include the restricted funds from our Athletic Association, Home and School, Marketing, Prayer Shawl Ministry, Quilters, Respect Life, Women of Mary, and our Endowment Fund.

### Points of Interest

- We currently have **\$112,575.34** in our reserve funds (our savings). **We are proud to report we have not used any of our reserves for general operations for the last 11 years.**
- We currently have **\$28,018.78** in the Building and Maintenance account which is restricted for Parish Capital improvements. This restricted account comes from various funds from estates designated to this account.
- We have **\$106,049.69** in our future Building Fund. **\$18,868.54** of these funds are pledges that were restricted by parishioners to church expansion only and not to the parish center.
- We have **\$16,835.02** in our Parish Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. It is truly a blessing that we have been able to maintain our two cemeteries the past eleven years from the funds from the annual offertory envelopes and the sale of lots and have not had to tap into the perpetual care funds again this year.
- We have **\$771,618.78** in our Parish and School Endowment Fund, that includes an endowed gift of **\$657,968.06** in 2009/2010 from the **Velma Lober** estate. This account has fluctuated due to stock market changes. Due to the Archdiocesan guidelines, funds from any parish/school endowment can only be withdrawn once a year in January. These funds are then budgeted for the following fiscal year. **These new guidelines help tremendously in preparing a more actual budget for the parish and school.** This past year, our earnings were **\$746.33**. We have chosen to retain this full amount as undistributed income in our endowment to continue to build upon our funds.
- **We are also thrilled to share the good news of the Year End Review of our parish school.** The amount of subsidy needed from our weekly Sunday collections to sustain our school this past fiscal year was **\$186,035**. This means that **29.32%** of our weekly contributions go towards maintaining a Catholic school. This is known as our "**school subsidy**".

As you can see from the report on the Year End Review of our Parish Subsidy to the school, we have made great strides at reducing the subsidy to our school. Our ultimate goal last year was to have the parish subsidy to the school at/or below **35%** which is recommended by the Archdiocese. **We have achieved our goal this year.** Our **budgeted** parish income has again been helped by the Lenten Fish Fries which brought an additional **\$23,127.39**, the annual School Dinner Auction which brought in additional revenue of **\$67,132.96**, and the Parish Picnic netted **\$30,674.21**. The Keep our Stars Shining Bright Raffle netted an income of **\$17,469.80** which went directly to the school budget for books and for improvements to the school's computer technology.

In the coming years the Archdiocese has mandated that all parish school subsidies should be at 20% of the parish's weekly offerings. We are well on our way to achieving this mandate. Our compliments go to **Shirley Bieser**, our principal, for her dedication of keeping within a balanced budget. **Our school is seen as a very financially viable school in comparison to many other schools in the archdiocese.**

**We, the Finance Committee of St. Joseph's, once again salute the recommendation made eight years ago by our Pastoral Council to go with the Archdiocesan Shared Accounting program.** All of our accounting is being done by the Archdiocese along with the verification of the Finance Committee. We are very pleased with the service they are providing. Our sincere thanks to **Jenna Christisen**, our Archdiocesan shared accountant, whose expertise is so greatly appreciated.

**We thank you, the parish community of St. Joseph's, for entrusting your faith in us to oversee the gifts you have faithfully given to God and our parish.** We encourage all within our parish to contact any one of us with any questions or concerns you may have.



*\*Note for 2008-2009 school year, the parish subsidy of the school is very low due to the inclusion of a very generous bequest. When considering the parish support as a percentage of offertory, if we do not include the bequest, the subsidy goes from 19.62% to 50.22% which is more accurate since this was a one time bequest. These funds have been placed into a restricted account to be used for the educational instruction of those students with special needs.*



## A Message from Fr. Abe...

### The Good and Faithful Steward

In history almost all wars were fought by desire for power and possessions. The root is greed and thirst for more. In our Gospel this Sunday [Lk 12:32-48] the Lord Jesus speaks of the faithful Steward who doesn't think much about himself but of the Will of God. Real peace is attained not by unbridled desire for gain but for surrendering to God. Jesus invites us to be that Steward, to develop the humility of Mary, the handmaid, who accepts wholeheartedly the will of God [Lk 1:38].

We are free. Free to choose the course of our life... to determine our own future... to realize our plans and ideas... to build our own happiness. However, we are reminded that everything is a gift from God. Everything is grace. God is the Divine Master not us. The world is created by Him [Jn 1:2-3] and entrusted to us to be taken care of [Gen 1:27-28]. We are called to return these gracious acts of God with love the way Jesus did. He lived as The Faithful Servant of Yahweh [Mk 14:36].

How do we apply this? Being stewards we do not only impose our will on others but we serve with love. We always think of what is good for others. We take good care of the environment by protecting, not by abusing. Husband and wife serve each other with dedication because they are each other's caretaker. Our kids are not possessions but must be nourished in love as children of God. On the part of the children we must take good care of our aging parents not as disposable objects but as manifestation of God. Then, we must be prudent with resources and use them for the glory of God instead of being corrupted by material things.

Besides Jesus and the Blessed Mother, I offer the person of St. Joseph to be our model of Servant-hood. He loved Mary not for his own gain but for her well-being [Mt 1:18-25]. He accepted the Child Jesus with all his heart even though it was not his own [Jn 6:42]. He served even though it hurt and gave all without expecting anything in return. May the Holy Spirit help us imitate St. Joseph - faithful until the very end.
