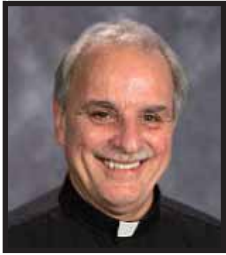

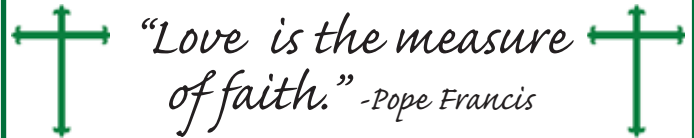

A Message from Fr. Abe...

Light in the Darkness

Our Gospel [Mt 4:12-23] opens with Jesus having heard of the imprisonment of St. John the Baptist and the Lord withdrew to the land of Galilee. This simple information requires deeper reflection.

The imprisonment of John affected Jesus. **The Lord cares.** He knows our sorrows. When we are troubled by sickness or unfortunate events, the Lord is turning into a loving parent, brother or best friend for us. He is sharing our pain personally. We are never alone in trials because God is there; He works in and with us mysteriously. We need to trust, and in times of difficulties, we intensify our union of heart and mind in Him through prayers by which we are strengthened by hope.

Jesus accepted the dangers and consequences of His ministry. John preached the message of repentance and reminded people of spiritual-moral values of God; in effect, he was arrested by an immoral king and later put to death by cunning plot. Jesus knew His ministry will be similar to that of John, but his message is much 'greater'. If He will continue the mission surely He too shall be arrested and put to death. Instead of being afraid, Jesus decided to push through with His salvific plan and started proclaiming the Good News which indeed led to Calvary. St. John Paul the Great summarized Jesus' attitude: 'Do not be afraid!' Jesus is telling us not to be afraid of the challenges of life. If we follow the will of God even death can be overcome and our sacrifices will be rewarded by heavenly blessings. We must not abandon the faith for the sake of feeling good. Life is a sacrifice and only those who are willing shall truly earn eternal life.

Be the light in the darkness. Jesus transformed the terrible news as an opportunity to be inspired by the Spirit to bring light to others. He continued the works of John and opened the way to Salvation in Galilee by preaching the Sermon on the Mount. We are called to do the same... to turn darkness into light. When weak we gain strength in faith. When a family member is sick we turn it into an occasion for community prayers. When troubled we cry to the Lord. **Jesus is our Light and by following His will we share His light to others.**

- Awards transfer should the student transfer to another eligible school within the Archdiocese of St. Louis.
- Maximum of one *Beyond Sunday* award per family per school. Families may be eligible for additional scholarship awards through other programs.
- Minimum annual tuition payment of \$500 per student is required. If award plus required minimum tuition exceeds total tuition, award amount shall be the remainder of tuition after minimum payment is subtracted.

Additional Information:

- An estimated 140 new awards will be granted in kindergarten; between 5 and 60 new awards will be granted in each remaining grade (first through eighth), with the fewest new awards in first grade.
- An estimated 750 students awarded in 2016-2017 will requalify for 2017-2018 scholarships.

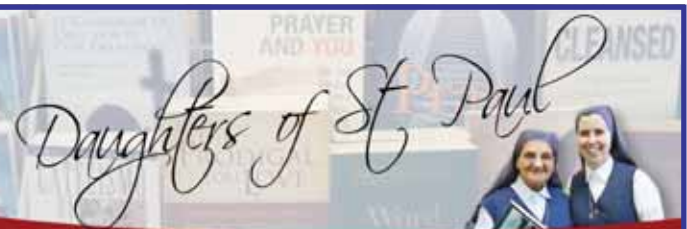
