

A Message from Fr. Abe...

Hope Shining in the Darkness

Mostly the news being broadcast today is violence, scandals and misery. The world is covered by darkness and the prevailing atmosphere is despair and uncertainty. Confronted by hovering darkness around the world the Catholic Church starts the Advent Season. We light the **first Candle of Advent – The Candle of Hope** – which



reminds that everything is not hopeless because the Savior born by the Virgin long ago shall return to give us life and have it to the full [Jn 10:10].

Every Catholic, then, must not be gloomy. **Despite our trials and problems our hearts must be full of hope.** We look at the world through the eyes of Jesus. We are not people of darkness but of light... the light that darkness never overcomes [Jn 1:5]. Instead, we carry this light, which is Jesus, and through Him we dispel the evil of this world. **We must become a City set on a hill giving inspiration to others through the Person of Christ the Savior** [cf. Mt 5:14-16].

Our Gospel this 1st Sunday of Advent [Mk 13:33-37] compels us to watch. We must be alert and observant and waiting...for the coming of Jesus in our life and in our world. Actually, Jesus already came [Jn 1:14]. He was born into this world, unfortunately His own people didn't recognize Him [Jn 1:11]. That is the darkness. When a person is blind to the presence of God and of his neighbor there is darkness... not because the sun is covered by smoke or our eyes enveloped by cataracts but because our hearts are incapacitated to love and appreciate the presence of another. God can be with us but we can blind to His presence.

Jesus is coming back but people are too preoccupied by non-essential things. Much worse, some even become blind to the presence of their parents whom they only remember for money. Some become blind to the presence of their spouse; spending more time for example, deer hunting or watching sporting events, rather than being with their wife. Some are becoming blind to their siblings to the point that they become strangers or enemies. When home is filled with strangers there is darkness over and within us.

May the Lord grant us hope enlightened by love so that we can dispel the darkness by recognizing His presence in the Eucharist and in people with and around us.





"Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time will come." - MARK 13:33

We all take things for granted. In particular, we take time for granted. Our lives are so busy, many of us are planning our time - our days, weeks, months, even years in advance. Remember, our time on earth is a gift. None of us knows how long we will be here. Start today and begin thanking God for each and every day. Take time in silence, every day, and listen to what God is saying to you.




